Bishop Dede will lead our service and preach that Sunday morning on zoom from her home. We expect to livestream it, too, on Facebook, as we did for our "experimental" Christmas Eve service. I hope that by then we will all have become zoom veterans and experts! Using that platform will permit us to have lectors reading the Sunday lessons and Lay Ministers leading the prayers in real-time, all from the relative comfort of their own homes, without pre-recording! We have this opportunity to welcome the bishop into our particular Sunday liturgy only once every 3 years or so; let's make it a parish celebration!

Sunday service at 9:30 am on FB live, followed by zoom coffee hour at 10:30 each week. Hug~A~Mug coffee and conversation hour on zoom, Wednesday mornings at 9:30.
